Adopt-a-Park

Program Information

Adopt-a-Park is open to community groups and businesses, churches and individual citizens who are interested in volunteering with the care and enhancement of public parks and open spaces.

In recognition of this service, groups will be named as adoptees on a personalized sign placed in the adopted park.

Litter should be picked up a minimum of three times per year: once April/May, June/July and August/September.

Groups designate a supervisor to organize the outings, inform the Public Works staff of planned litter pickups, arrange for distribution of trash bags and final bag pickup.



Adopt-a-Park Sign

Work safely

- Work during daylight hours and good weather.
- Have responsible adult supervision for participants under 18.
- Never try to pick up heavy, large or hazardous materials. Contact the Public Works Department for pickup.
- Don't crush collected trash to make more room in the bag; broken or jagged objects could cause accidental injuries.
- Don't overexert yourself; take plenty of breaks.
- Report vandalism, potential safety hazards or other concerns to the Public Works Department.

What to bring

- Work gloves
- Tennis shoes or work boots
- High-visibility vest or bright/light colors
- Water
- First aid kit
- Rakes, shovels, buckets

Be prepared

- Provide current contact information for all participants.
- Schedule dates and tasks in advance.
- Obtain pre-approval for any changes or enhancements to the park.
- Provide your own transportation.
- Coordinate publicity events with Public Works staff.
